




Welcome Home - Thunder Bay, Ontario

About the area

The City of Thunder Bay¹

- is located in the northwest of the province of Ontario
- has an international airport and is a regional hub for Northern Ontario

Thunder Bay has a significant Indigenous population and the city is growing more diverse as new immigrants arrive. Thunder Bay is situated on the coast of Lake Superior, with breathtaking views, incredible hiking trails, and spectacular provincial parks.

Thunder Bay enjoys four seasons. Winters are cold and snowy with an average daily low temperature of -18°C in January. Summers are warm with an average daily high of 24°C in July.

<u>Indigenous peoples</u> have lived in Canada since before European settlers and explorers arrived. Thunder Bay is located on the traditional lands of the Anishinaabe and Métis Peoples, and Fort William First Nation, signatory of the Robinson Superior Treaty.

Living, working and going to school

Thunder Bay is a great place to work, do business, study, and live a fulfilling life.

You can find jobs in industries such as

- mining
- education

- transportation
- health

As of January 2023, the <u>official minimum wage of Ontario</u> is \$15.50 an hour. Thunder Bay is a great place to develop careers, do business, study, and live a fulfilling life.

Housing costs vary. The <u>average price to buy a single-family house</u> is approximately \$700,000. <u>Renting a 2-bedroom apartment</u> could cost approximately \$1,200 a month.

There are many <u>schools</u>, <u>daycares</u>, and after-school programs in both English and French. In Canada, students usually go to school from kindergarten (age 3 or 4) to grade 12 (age 17 or 18). After that, they can go to college or university or start working.
