About the area

The <u>City of Winnipeg</u> is the capital of the province of Manitoba. Winnipeg offers a wide range of programs and services for its residents with the goal of creating a welcoming, safe, and healthy community for everyone.

Manitoba¹

- borders Saskatchewan, Ontario, and Nunavut in Canada, and North Dakota and Minnesota in the United States of America
- has a sizeable French-speaking population, and the main language of the province is English

Winnipeg has mild springs, hot summers, colourful falls, and bright winters. Winters are cold and snowy with an average daily low temperature of -19°C in January. Summers are warm with an average daily high of 27°C in July.

Indigenous land acknowledgement

<u>Indigenous peoples</u> have lived in Canada since before European settlers and explorers arrived. Winnipeg is located in <u>Treaty One Territory</u>, the home and traditional lands of the Anishinaabe (Ojibwe), Ininew (Cree) and Dakota Peoples, and in the Homeland of the Red River Métis.

Living, working and going to school

Winnipeg is a great place to develop careers, do business, study, and live a fulfilling life.

You can find jobs in industries such as

- aerospace
- advanced manufacturing
- agribusiness

- information and communication technology
- health
- education

As of April 1, 2023, the official minimum wage in Manitoba is \$14.15 an hour.

<u>Housing</u> costs vary. The <u>average price to buy a single-family house</u> is approximately \$595,000. <u>Renting a 2-bedroom apartment could cost approximately \$1,350 a month.</u>

There are many <u>schools</u>, daycares, and after-school programs in both English and <u>French</u>. In Canada, students usually go to school from kindergarten (age 3 or 4) to grade 12 (age 17 or 18). After that, they can go to college or university or start working.
