

2014 Northern Ontario Energy Credit (NOEC) - Calculation sheet for single individuals who have no children

Use this calculation if you were single on December 31, 2013, and do not have the care of a child under the age of 18 on the first day of the payment month.

You may have to use a different calculation sheet for a particular month if you become a parent of a child under the age of 18.

To be eligible for the NOEC, you, or someone on your behalf, paid at least one of the following amounts for your <u>principal residence</u> in Northern Ontario for 2013:

- <u>rent;</u>
- property tax;
- accommodation costs for a public long-term care home; and/or
- home energy costs on a reserve.

If your adjusted net income is:

- \$37,843.00 or less, your annual entitlement is \$141.00;
- between \$37,843.00 and \$51,943.00, complete the calculation below to determine how much you will get; or
- \$51,943.00 or more, you are not entitled to a NOEC payment.

If your annual NOEC amount plus, if applicable, your annual Ontario sales tax credit and Ontario energy and property tax credit is:

- \$2.00 or less, no payment will be issued.
- from \$2.01 to \$10.00, you will receive one payment of \$10.00.
- \$360.00 or less, you will receive it in one payment instead of monthly.

The first monthly 2014 Ontario trillium benefit payment, which includes any NOEC entitlement, will be issued on July 10, 2014.
