## About the area

Red Deer

- is located in central Alberta, between Edmonton and Calgary
- is known as one of Canada's most entrepreneurial cities
- is known for its rich natural beauty

Alberta ${ }^{1}$ borders British Columbia, Saskatchewan, and Northwest Territories in Canada, and Montana in the United States of America.

Alberta has on average 312 sunny days and up to 18 hours of daylight in the summer. Winters are cold and snowy, with an average daily low temperature of $-10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ in January. Summers are warm with an average daily high of $23^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ in July.

## Indigenous land acknowledgement

Indigenous peoples have lived in Canada since before European settlers and explorers arrived. Red Deer, like much of Alberta, is situated on Treaty 7 land, the traditional territory of the Blackfoot, Tsuu T'ina and Stoney Nakoda Peoples, and the central Alberta region falls under Treaty 6, traditional Métis, Cree and Saulteaux territory.

## Living, working and going to school

Red Deer is a great place to work, do business, study, and live a fulfilling life.

You can find jobs in Red Deer in industries such as

- health care
- retail trade
- construction
- oil and gas
- mining
- educational services
- manufacturing

The official minimum wage in Alberta is $\$ 15$ an hour.

Housing costs vary. The average price to buy a single-family house is approximately $\$ 580,000$. Renting a 2-bedroom apartment could cost approximately \$1,100 a month.

There are many schools, daycares, and after-school programs. In Canada, students usually go to school from kindergarten (3 or 4 ) to grade 12 (17 or 18). After that, they can get a post-secondary education or start working.

- University of Alberta (Red Deer satellite location)
- Red Deer Polytechnic
- Olds College of Agriculture \& Technology

- hockey
