Use this form to register your court order or written agreement if either of the following applies:

- Your order or agreement was made after April 1997 and it specifies support payments for a **spouse** or **common-law partner**.
- Your order or agreement was made before May 1997, it specifies support payments for a spouse **or** clearly specifies separate amounts for a spouse and for a child, **and** any of the following apply:
 - You have filed Form T1157, Election for Child Support Payments.
 - Your order or agreement was changed after April 1997 to increase or decrease the amount of child support payable.
