

FACTS ABOUT HPV

(Human Papillomavirus)

HPV IS VERY COMMON

About 75% of sexually active people get HPV at some point.

2 HPV OFTEN HAS NO SYMPTOMS

Most infections cause no symptoms.

3 HPV IS CONTAGIOUS

It spreads through intimate skin-to-skin contact, not bodily fluids.

4 LOW-RISK HPV AND WARTS

Low-risk HPV types can cause genital warts but don't lead to cancer.

5 HIGH-RISK HPV AND CANCER

A high-risk type needs follow-up monitoring for cervical cell changes.

6 MOST HPV CLEARS ON ITS OWN

Many infections go away within one to two years without causing any issues.

7 HPV CAN STAY DORMANT

HPV that doesn't clear can remain for years without you knowing.

8 SMOKING SLOWS HPV RECOVERY

Smoking and vaping weakens the immune system, making HPV harder to clear.

9 HPV VACCINATION PROTECTS

The vaccine prevents new infections and is recommended for all genders.

HPV CAN AFFECT ANYONE

It can cause cervical, anal, penile, throat, and other cancers in all genders.

Getting screened (tested) and vaccination lowers the risk.
