Submitting your **Notice of Intent to Travel (NOIT)** isn't just paperwork – it's how the Defence can locate you if needed and can protect or support you if something goes wrong abroad.

Before travel: Notice of Intent to Travel (NOIT)

On-duty: Required
Personal: Highly Recommended

Submit an **NOIT (outside Canada/USA)**
(or through Monitor Mass for CAF members)

Leaving Canada with DWAN portable devices?

On-duty:
Request to Use Electronic Devices during On-Duty Travel Outside Canada

Personal:
Request to Use PITDs for Non-Duty Travel Outside Canada

** Non duty travel over 30 days requires L1 / ADM approval*

Travelling with DND/CAF devices

1 Device Preparation

Reduce risk before crossing borders

- Bring only the **minimum number of Portable Information Technology Devices (PITD)** required
- Limit sensitive information** to what is strictly necessary for the trip

2 Border Inspections & Authority Access

What to expect and how to respond

Border agents may request passwords / PINs
If your device is inspected:

- Document what occurred
- Change passwords immediately
- Report immediately to your:
Chain of command and Information System Security Officer (ISSO)

3 Transport & handling

Protect devices at all times, keep them with you – never unattended

must be protected against:

- Physical damage, unauthorized removal or tampering, magnetic fields or environmental risks etc.

If a device is compromised or involved in an incident:



Do not reconnect to DND/CAF networks and report immediately to the ISSO and IT asset manager.
