## **Managing Suspicious Mail**

Suspicious packages can be dangerous and may appear in different forms, such as letters, parcels, suitcases, backpacks or any type of container. DND employees and CAF members can deal with suspicious packages by following these tips:

Recognize the warning signs of suspicious mail:

**Excessive postage** 

Strange odour or noise

Restrictive markings (e.g. Do not X-ray)

Misspelled or badly typed words


Unfamiliar return address or none at all

**Protruding wires** 

Addressed to a business title only

Excessive wrapping, tape or string

Oily stains, leaking or crystallization on wrapping



Steps to take if you're concerned about a package or letter you've received:







Get everyone out of the room and close the door.





Notify the military or civilian police.

Leave the letter or package where it is.
