


Department of the Environment

Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to section 127 of the Canadian Environmental Protection Act, 1999 (CEPA), disposal at sea permit no. PYR-00162-1 authorizing the loading for disposal and the disposal of waste or other matter at sea is approved. The permit is published on the Canadian Environmental Protection Act Registry on Tuesday, June 15, 2021.

- 1. Permittee: Matcon Excavation and Shoring Ltd., Coquitlam, British Columbia.
- 2. Waste or other matter to be disposed of: inert, inorganic geological matter.
- 2.1. Nature of waste or other matter: inert, inorganic geological matter; all wood, topsoil, asphalt and other debris are to be segregated for disposal by methods other than disposal at sea.
- 3. Duration of permit: The permit is valid from June 22, 2021, to June 21, 2022.
- 4. Loading sites: various approved excavation sites in British Columbia, at approximately 49.27250° N, 123.11167° W North American Datum of 1983 (NAD83).
- 5. Disposal site: Point Grey disposal site, within a 1-nautical-mile radius of 49.25666° N, 123.36500° W (NAD83).
- 6. Method of loading: Loading will be carried out using land-based heavy equipment, trucks or conveyor belts.
- 7. Route to disposal site and method of transport: most direct navigational route from the loading sites to the disposal site via hopper scow or towed scow.
- 8. Method of disposal: Disposal will be carried out by bottom dumping or end dumping.
- 9. Total quantity to be disposed of: not to exceed 125 000 cubic metres, place measure.
- 10. The permittee shall obtain from the permit-issuing office a letter of confirmation for each loading and disposal activity prior to undertaking the work and shall conduct these activities in accordance with the relevant letter of confirmation. The permittee shall follow the procedures outlined in the document titled "Disposal at Sea - Requests for Letters of Confirmation Under Multi-Site Excavation Permits. Standard Procedures" (March 2021)
- 11. Fees: The fee prescribed by the *Disposal at Sea Permit Fee Regulations* shall be paid by the permittee in accordance with those regulations as modified according to the provisions of the Service Fees Act. The applicable fee rates for April 1, 2020, are in effect for the duration of this permit.





12. Inspection:

- 12.1. By accepting this permit, the permittee and its contractors accept that they are subject to inspection pursuant to Part 10 of CEPA.
- 12.2. The permittee shall ensure that records of all loading and disposal activities are kept on site for the duration of the permit and are available for inspection by any enforcement officer or analyst, for 2 years following the expiry of the permit.
- 12.3. Ships operating under the authority of this permit shall carry and display a radar-reflecting device at all times mounted on the highest practical location.
- 13. Contractors:
- 13.1. The loading or disposal at sea referred to under this permit shall not be carried out by any person without written authorization from the permittee.
- 13.2. The permittee shall ensure that all persons involved in the loading, transport or disposal activities authorized by this permit conduct these activities in accordance with the relevant permit conditions.
- 14. Reporting and notification:
- 14.1. The permittee shall provide the following information at least 48 hours before loading and disposal activities commence: name or number of ship, platform or structure used to carry out the loading and/or disposal, name of the contractor including corporate and on-site contact information, and expected period of loading and disposal activities. - 14.2. The permittee must send all project-related notifications to the First Nations identified in paragraph 14.1.
- 14.3. The permittee must provide the First Nations' representatives identified in paragraph 14.1 at least 48 hours' notice of the work itinerary.
- 14.4. The permittee shall submit a written report to the minister, as represented by the regional director of the Environmental Protection Operations Directorate, Pacific and Yukon Region, within 30 days after the expiry of the permit. This report shall contain the following information: a list of all work completed pursuant to the permit, including the location of the loading and disposal sites used, the quantity of matter disposed of at the disposal site and the dates on which disposal activities occurred. The report shall be sent to the regional director at any of the following coordinates:

14.5. At all times, a copy of this permit and of documents and drawings referenced in this permit shall be available at the loading sites and on all powered ships directly engaged in the loading and disposal operations.

15. Special precautions:

15.1. The permittee shall submit a written excavated material disposal plan to the minister, as represented by the regional director of the Environmental Protection Operations Directorate, Pacific and Yukon Region, identified in paragraph 14.1, for approval by the Department of the Environment prior to the commencement of the first excavation operation authorized by this permit. The plan shall address procedures to accurately measure or estimate quantities of excavated material disposed of at the disposal site, vessel tracking, and a schedule for use of the disposal site. Modifications to the plan shall be made only with the written approval of the Department of the Environment.

- 15.2. The loading and disposal at sea referred to under this permit shall be carried out in accordance with the mitigation measures summarized in the document titled "Environmental Protection Plan Matcon Excavation & Shoring Ltd. Disposal at Sea Permit # PYR-00162-1" (March 2021).
- 15.3 The permittee must consult with potentially affected First Nations listed in paragraph 14.1 on any modifications to the Environmental Protection Plan.
- 15.4 The permittee must ensure that transportation and disposal activities do not impede Fisheries and Oceans Canada's authorized food, social and ceremonial fisheries for Indigenous Peoples.
