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CANADIAN ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT

Order Amending the Domestic Substances List

Whereas, pursuant to subsection 25(1) of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*¹, the Minister of the Environment is satisfied that certain substances were, between January 1, 1984 and December 31, 1986,

- (a) manufactured in or imported into Canada by a person in a quantity of not less than 100 kg in any one calendar year, or
- (b) in Canadian commerce or used for commercial manufacturing purposes in Canada;

Therefore, the Minister of the Environment, pursuant to subsection 25(1) of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*¹, hereby makes the annexed *Order Amending the Domestic Substances List*.

ORDER AMENDING THE DOMESTIC SUBSTANCES LIST

AMENDMENTS

1. The heading "**Substances Other Than Substances assigned a Confidential Substance Identity Number**" before section 1² and sections 1 and 2 of the *Domestic Substances List*³ are replaced by the following:

- 1) This List contains substances referred to in subsections 25(1) and 30(1) of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act* and is made up of the following Parts:
 - a) Part I sets out substances that are chemicals or polymers, other than substances referred to in paragraph (b), identified by their Chemical Abstracts Service Registry Numbers;
 - b) Part II sets out substances that are chemicals or polymers that, in order to protect confidential information in accordance with section 20 of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*, are identified by their masked names, in accordance with the *Masked Name Regulations*, and by their Confidential Substance Identity Numbers assigned by the Department of the Environment;
 - c) Part III sets out substances that are biotechnology products, other than substances referred to in paragraph (d), that are identified
 - i) in the case of enzymes, by their International Union of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology Numbers,
 - ii) in the case of organisms, by their specific substance names, and
 - iii) in the case of other substances, by their Chemical Abstracts Service Registry Numbers; and
 - d) Part IV sets out substances that are biotechnology products that, in order to protect confidential information in accordance with section 20 of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*, are identified by their masked names, in accordance with the *Masked Name Regulations*, and by their Confidential Substance Identity Numbers assigned by the Department of the Environment

2. The heading to Part I of the List is replaced by the following:

CHEMICALS AND POLYMERS, OTHER THAN THOSE ASSIGNED A CONFIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE IDENTITY NUMBER

3. The notes¹ to Part I of the List are replaced by the following:

- NOTES:
1. The letter "N" after a substance identifier indicates that the prescribed information has been provided to the Minister in accordance with subsection 26(1) of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act* and assessed by the Minister under section 28 of that Act.
 2. The letter "T" after a substance identifier indicates that the prescribed information has been provided to the Minister in accordance with subsection 26(2) of the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*.
