

Lithium-ion Batteries

Don't Go up in Smoke!



Lithium-ion battery fires in larger, more powerful rechargeable products can be severe and hard to extinguish.

Reduce your fire risk:

- ✓ Use the original battery and charger that came with your device.
- ✓ Contact the original manufacturer or product retailer if you need a replacement battery.
- ✓ Charge your battery away from exit doors in case of fire.
- ✓ Store and use your battery according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- ✓ Never modify, tamper with or build your own lithium-ion battery.
- ✓ Never use a damaged or modified battery. Dispose of batteries that are worn out or show signs of damage.
- ✓ Check with your municipality on how to safely dispose of your batteries.
