

Lithium-ion battery fires in larger, more powerful rechargeable products, like e-bikes, e-scooters and large power tools, can be severe and hard to extinguish. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging, use and storage.

## Reduce your fire risk:



Use the battery and charger that came with your device. Never use a damaged battery and don't modify, tamper with or build your own battery.



If you need a replacement battery, contact the original manufacturer or product retailer.



Charge your batteries away from exit doors in case of fire. Store at room temperature.



Check with your municipality on how to safely dispose of your batteries.
