

Know the Signs of an Opioid Overdose



Blue lips or nails



Dizziness and confusion



Can't be woken up



Choking, gurgling or snoring sounds



Slow, weak or no breathing



Drowsiness or difficulty staying awake

Suspect an Overdose?

CALL **911** or your local emergency number

Administer **naloxone** if you have it

Stay with the person until help arrives

Saving a life is the number one priority during an overdose

Even if you've taken drugs or have some on you, the Good Samaritan law protects you from:

- Simple drug possession charges
- Violation of conditions regarding simple possession in:

pre-trial release

conditional sentences

probation orders

parole

This law applies to the person who has overdosed, the person who seeks help and anyone at the scene when help arrives.
