

INDIGENOUS KNOWLEDGE POLICY FRAMEWORK FOR PROJECT REVIEWS AND REGULATORY DECISIONS

Snapshot of Engagement

2018

Bills C-68 and C-69 introduced, providing for mandatory consideration of Indigenous Knowledge in proposed project reviews and regulatory decisions, when provided.

MAY - JUNE 2019

Discussion paper released for public comment – 55 submissions received including 37 from Indigenous organizations and individuals.

AUGUST 28, 2019

The Acts came into force including mandatory consideration of Indigenous Knowledge.

SEPTEMBER 2020

What We Heard Report (summary of engagement with Indigenous Peoples to support the development of the Framework).

MAY - OCTOBER 2021

Indigenous communities and organizations invited to review draft Framework (funding made available, 79 submissions received).

FALL - WINTER 2021/2022

Draft Framework revised based on feedback received.

FEBRUARY - JUNE 2019

25 engagement sessions with Indigenous Peoples, conducted to seek input on principles, best practices and other elements to inform the development of the Framework.

JUNE 21, 2019

Royal Assent granted to bills C-68 and C-69.

AUGUST 2020

Agency's Indigenous Advisory Committee penned document "Principles for the development of the Indigenous Knowledge Policy Framework" to inform the development of the Framework.

FALL 2020 - SPRING 2021

The four government departments involved in Bills C-68 and C-69 penned the draft Framework.

SUMMER 2021

Three video-conferences held to present the Framework to Indigenous communities and organizations and answer questions.
