The province of Prince Edward Island (PEI)¹

- includes the cities of Charlottetown (the capital) and Summerside
- is near the provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick
- has vibrant Acadian and Francophone communities

PEI is known for its rich natural beauty and world-class seafood.

<u>Winters</u> are cold and snowy, with an average daily low temperature of -11°C in January. Summers are warm with an average daily high of 28°C in July.

Living, working and going to school

PEI is a great place to work,, do business, study, and live a fulfilling life.

You can find jobs in PEI in industries such as

- fishing
- agriculture
- manufacturing

- tourism
- exports
- bioscience

As of January 1, 2023, the official minimum wage in PEI is \$14.50 an hour.

Housing costs vary. The <u>average price to buy a single-family house</u> is approximately \$517,000. <u>Renting a 2-bedroom apartment</u> could cost approximately \$1,000 a month.

There are many <u>schools</u>, daycares, and after-school programs. In Canada, students usually go to school from kindergarten (age 3 or 4) to grade 12 (age 17 or 18). After that, they can go to college or university or start working.

<u>PEI</u> has over <u>1,100 kilometres</u> of smooth sand and red sandstone cliffs along its coast. You can also enjoy <u>public parks</u> and other outdoor spaces in summer, and fun activities like <u>skiing</u>, sledding, and skating in the winter.
