




Welcome Home – Saskatoon, Saskatchewan



Population: 317,480 people (2021 census) (includes many South and West Asians, Arabs and Afghans)

About the area

<u>Saskatchewan¹</u> borders the provinces of Manitoba and Alberta, and the Northwest Territories, and Montana and North Dakota in the United States of America.

<u>Saskatoon</u>

- is located in the central part of the province of Saskatchewan
- has an international airport
- is the largest city in the province and straddles the South Saskatchewan River
- has beautiful walking trails in the Meesawin River Valley
- has been welcoming newcomers and growing over the years

Saskatoon enjoys four seasons with very cold, sunny <u>winters</u> and hot summers. The daily low temperature in January can reach -33°C and the daily high in July can reach 26°C.

Living, working and going to school

Saskatchewan is considered a desirable place to live because of the low cost of living and the many employment opportunities. Saskatoon has over 60 different neighbourhoods, some very new and others more historic.

You can find jobs in Saskatoon in industries such as

- health care
- agriculture
- manufacturing
- trades

- construction
- education
- business

Saskatoon's <u>cost of living</u> is one of the lowest among major cities in Canada, which means you pay less for essentials such as housing, food and utilities. As of October 1, 2022, the <u>official minimum wage of</u> <u>Saskatchewan</u> is \$13 an hour.

Housing costs in Saskatoon vary. The <u>average price to buy a single-family house</u> is approximately \$530,000. <u>Renting a 2-bedroom apartment</u> could cost approximately \$1,200 a month.
