



Context of immigration in Canada

Non-permanent residents

- Asylum seekers
- Persons with a work or study permit

Immigrants

- **Economic immigrants** (~60%): Contributing to Canada's economy
- **Immigrants sponsored by family** (~27%): Reuniting with family members
- **Refugees** (~12%): Seeking protection and escaping persecution

In 2016, immigrants represented 21.9% of the Canadian population.

Census of Population

- The Census provides a cross-sectional snapshot of the population every 5 years.
- The most recent Census was conducted on May 10, 2016.
- New variables on admission category of immigrants added to the 2016 Census as a result of STC-IRCC collaboration



The Census of Population is a key data source on immigration in Canada

- Place of birth
- Immigration
 - landed immigrants / permanent residents
 - non-permanent residents
 - year of immigration (can identify recent immigrants)
 - admission category and applicant type
- Citizenship
 - Canadian citizens by birth / by naturalization
 - citizens of other countries
 - multiple citizenships
- Generation status and place of birth of parents
- Other topics...
 - Language
 - mother tongue, home & work languages
 - knowledge of official languages and non-official languages
 - Ethnocultural characteristics
 - Labour
 - Labour force status
 - Industry and occupation of employment
 - Full-time vs. part-time
 - Education
 - Highest degree, diploma, certificate
 - Major field of study
 - Location of study (e.g. inside or outside Canada)
 - Income
 - Housing
 - And more...

Longitudinal Immigration Database (IMDB)

- The IMDB connects immigration and citizenship data with longitudinal socio-economic outcomes, facilitating broad and detailed analysis and research
- The IMDB is updated every year with the latest tax information
- Immigration Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and Statistics Canada have been in collaboration extensively on its development since its beginning

IMDB: Coverage




Median total income of principal applicants


