2016–2017 ANNUAL REPORT PRIVACY ACT



1. INTRODUCTION

The *Privacy Act* (the "Act") gives Canadian citizens as well as individuals and corporations present in Canada the right to access records under the control of federal government institutions, subject to limited and specific exceptions. The Act is intended to complement existing procedures for access to government information and not to limit in any way information that is normally available to the public.

Section 72 of the Act requires the head of every federal government institution to submit a report to Parliament on the administration of the Act at their institution each fiscal year.

This report was prepared pursuant to section 72 of the Act and describes how the National Film Board of Canada (the "NFB") administered the *Privacy Act* in fiscal year 2016–2017.

The NFB's mandate is to produce and distribute distinctive, culturally diverse, challenging and relevant audiovisual works that provide Canada and the world with a unique Canadian perspective.

2. ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACT

In accordance with section 73 of the Act, the Minister of Canadian Heritage appoints the following individuals to administer the *Privacy Act*.

- > The Government Film Commissioner or any person filling this position temporarily;
- > The Secretary to the Board of Trustees or any person filling this position temporarily;
- > The Privacy Coordinator or any person filling this position temporarily.

The NFB has no official entity tasked with processing access to personal information requests. The requests are forwarded to the Privacy Coordinator, who is part of the Business Affairs and Legal Services department.

The Privacy Coordinator is also responsible for coordination pursuant to the Access to Information Act.

4. INTERPRETATION OF THE STATISTICAL REPORT

A copy of the 2016-2017 statistical report is attached as Appendix B.

Requests submitted pursuant to the Privacy Act

The NFB received 2 personal information requests between April 1, 2016, and March 31, 2017, compared with 4 requests received in 2015–2016.

Fully processed requests

The NFB fully processed the 2 requests received during the 2016–2017 reporting period.

The NFB processed these requests as follows:

- 1 all-exempted request (50%); and
- > 1 request for which no records existed (50%).

Turnaround time and postponements

The NFB processed the 2 requests completed during the 2016–2017 reporting period within the following timeframes:

- > 1 request (50%) processed within not more than 15 days; and
- > 1 request (50%) processed within not more than 30 days;

Exemptions and exclusions

During the 2016–2017 reporting period, the NFB invoked one exemption pursuant to section 27 of the Act. No exclusions were invoked.

5. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

NFB employees completed the online course "Access to Information and Privacy Fundamentals (1015)," delivered via the Canada School of Public Service website.

NEW POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

No new or revised organizational policies or procedures pursuant to the administration of the Act were implemented during the reporting period.

COMPLAINTS AND INQUIRIES

The NFB did not receive any privacy complaints and was not subject to any investigations during the reporting period.

8. MONITORING OF THE TIME TO PROCESS REQUESTS

No monitoring of the amount of time required to process privacy requests was conducted during the reporting period.

9. MATERIAL PRIVACY BREACHES

No material privacy breaches occurred during the reporting period.

10. EVALUATION OF FACTORS RELATING TO PRIVACY (EFRP)

The NFB did not initiate or complete any privacy-impact assessments during the reporting period.

11. DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

No personal information was disclosed in compliance with clause 8(2)m) of the Act.
