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Introduction

The Access to Information Act gives Canadian citizens and permanent residents, and any person and corporation present in Canada, the right to access information contained in federal government records, subject to certain specific and limited exceptions.

Section 94(1) of the act requires the head of each government institution to prepare an annual report on the administration of the act within the institution and to submit the report to Parliament.

This annual report on the Access to Information Act at the Office of the Auditor General of Canada (OAG) describes how we administered our responsibilities under the act during the 2025–26 fiscal year.

Who we are

The OAG audits federal government operations and provides Parliament with independent information, advice, and assurance regarding the federal government's stewardship of public funds.

We are in the business of legislative auditing. We conduct:

- performance audits of federal organizations
- annual financial audits of the government's financial statements
- special examinations and annual financial audits of Crown corporations
- audits of the governments of Nunavut, Yukon, and the Northwest Territories

Since 1995, the OAG has also had a specific environmental and sustainable development mandate, which is carried out by the Commissioner of the Environment and Sustainable Development on behalf of the Auditor General of Canada. The Commissioner has additional responsibilities under the Federal Sustainable Development Act and the Canadian Net-Zero Emissions Accountability Act to review and monitor the Government of Canada's sustainable development strategies and its implementation of measures aimed at mitigating climate change.

The OAG did not have any wholly owned subsidiaries during the reporting period.

Organizational structure

The Access to Information and Privacy (ATIP) team reports to the Information and Data Management group, which is a subgroup of the Digital Services Group. The full-time ATIP Coordinator is supported by an ATIP analyst and paralegal, legal counsel, and administrative staff as required. The main activities of the ATIP team include:

- monitoring compliance with ATIP legislation and relevant procedures and policies
- processing requests under both the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act
- developing and maintaining policies, procedures, and guidelines to ensure that the OAG respected the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act
- promoting awareness of the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act within the OAG to ensure that employees were aware of their responsibilities
- preparing annual reports to Parliament and other materials that central agencies might require
- representing the OAG in dealings with the Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat, the information and privacy commissioners, and other government organizations in matters pertaining to the Access to Information Act and the Privacy Act
- helping the OAG meet its commitments to ensure openness and transparency, through proactive and informal disclosure of information

During the reporting period the OAG was not party to any service agreements pursuant to section 96 of the Access to Information Act.

Proactive publication of information pursuant to Part 2 of the act is coordinated by the Information and Data Management group. For a breakdown of the group and positions responsible for meeting each applicable proactive publication requirement under Part 2 of the act, see the section “Proactive publication under Part 2 of the act.”

Performance under Part 1 of the Access to Information Act, 2025–26

During the reporting period, from April 1, 2025, to March 31, 2026, the OAG received 31 formal requests and carried 2 requests over from the previous reporting period, 20 of which were closed during the reporting period and 13 of which were carried over to the next reporting period within legislated timelines. All requests were closed within legislated timelines.

Of the 20 requests that were received and closed during the reporting period,

- 3 requests were closed within 0 to 15 days
- 6 requests were closed within 16 to 30 days
- 6 requests were closed within 31 to 60 days
- 3 requests were closed within 61 to 120 days
- 2 requests were closed within 181 to 365 days

Of the 33 requests received,

- 6 requests were disclosed in their entirety, amounting to 30% of closed requests
- 4 requests were disclosed in part, amounting to 20% of closed requests
- 3 requests were withheld in their entirety due to exemptions
- 5 requests had no records in existence
- 1 request was transferred
- 1 request was abandoned
- 13 requests were carried over to the next reporting period

No formal Access to Information Act requests exceeded their legislative deadlines during the reporting period.

The OAG did not receive any complaints during the reporting period.

Extensions

During the reporting period, the OAG invoked extensions in processing 6 requests: 1 extension of less than 30 days, 4 extensions of 31 to 60 days, 1 extension of 121 to 180 days, and 1 extension of 181 to 365 days.

Of the extensions,

- 2 extensions were pursuant to section 9(1)(a) of the act—for interference with operations
- 1 extension was pursuant to section 9(1)(b) of the act—for consultations
- 4 extensions were pursuant to section 9(1)(c) of the act—for third party notice

Consultations

Consultations received from other government departments are commonly related to ongoing audits, and while the OAG is required to withhold audit information pursuant to section 16.1(1)(a) of the Access to Information Act, consulting departments cannot invoke the same exemption. Therefore, the OAG cannot recommend doing so. If the records refer to an ongoing audit, the OAG typically recommends an exemption pursuant to section 22 of the act if disclosure of the records could prejudice the outcome of the audit.

The OAG responded to 51 consultations during the reporting period and recommended exemptions in 7 cases.

Of the consultations closed during the reporting period

- 33 requests were closed within 0 to 15 days
- 11 requests were closed within 16 to 30 days
- 3 requests were closed within 31 to 60 days
- 4 requests were closed within 61 to 120 days

Training and awareness

The OAG requires that all employees complete mandatory ATIP training, offered by the Canada School of Public Service as an online, self-paced course. All new OAG employees are required to complete the training within 3 months of the start date of their employment.

During the reporting period, 30 employees completed this training.

The ATIP Coordinator regularly provides OAG employees with guidance and briefings on the processing of ATIP requests. Furthermore, information and tools to help employees process ATIP requests are available on the OAG's external and internal websites.

Policies, guidelines, and procedures

The OAG did not create any new policies, guidelines, or procedures during the reporting period.

The OAG follows policies, directives, and guidance set by the Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat, in alignment with core federal departments.

Initiatives and projects to improve access to information

The OAG has acquired a Government of Canada enterprise application, ATIPXpress, hosted by Shared Services Canada, in alignment with Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat guidance. This software is planned to be implemented during the 2026–27 reporting period.

A form to submit ATIP requests and inquiries can be found on the OAG website. The OAG has onboarded to the Treasury Board ATIP online tool to receive formal and informal request submissions. Additionally, the OAG waives application fees when requested.

Summary of key issues and actions taken on complaints

The OAG did not receive any complaints pursuant to the Access to Information Act during this reporting period, and no investigations regarding the OAG were carried out.

Proactive publication under Part 2 of the act

The OAG fulfilled its obligation for proactive disclosure requirements by ensuring that all relevant information was posted online by the prescribed publication timeline ([Exhibit 1](#)). For 2025–26, the OAG achieved 100% compliance.

Monitoring compliance

The OAG uses a case management system that tracks both active and closed requests. The system is designed to track legislative deadlines. A combination of training and system-generated reminders are used to ensure compliance is met where required.

The ATIP team holds biweekly meetings to discuss request-related activities, determine timelines, and help ensure that all team members are informed of the status of files.

Regular meetings are also held with the executive members responsible for ATIP matters.

Senior officials, up to and including the Auditor General, are advised about compliance with legislative, policy, and regulatory obligations, as requested or required.

As reflected in section 11.2 of the appendix, the OAG dedicated 1.0 person-years to ATIP-related activities during the reporting period. The ATIP team and its activities are described in the section “Organizational structure” at the beginning of this report.

Proactive publications are not monitored by software or applications. User knowledge, training, experience, and expertise ensure that deadlines and requirements are met.
