This includes the obligation to perform their official duties and arrange their private affairs in a manner that will bear the closest public scrutiny, an obligation that is not fully discharged by simply acting within the law—as well as the obligation to act with honesty and uphold the highest ethical standards so that public confidence and trust in the integrity, objectivity and impartiality of the government are conserved and enhanced.				
Appointees who are defined as public office holders in the <i>Conflict of Interest Act</i> are subject to that Act. Those appointed on a <u>full-time basis</u> must also submit to the <u>Office of the Conflict of Interest and Ethics Commissioner</u> , within 60 days of appointment, a confidential report in which they disclose all their assets, liabilities and outside activities.
