<p>The Government of Canada is launching the Buy Canadian Policy to protect and prioritize Canadian workers and industries and strengthen Canada’s domestic economy.</p> <p>PacifiCan would like to learn more about how your business and proposed project may be able to prioritize Canadian suppliers, materials (steel, wood products, and aluminum), and content (portion of goods and services produced in Canada).</p> <p>Use of Canadian suppliers, materials, and content is not required to be eligible for the Regional Defence Investment Initiative. However, priority may be given to projects that are able to demonstrate significant use of Canadian suppliers, materials, and content.</p> <p>Definitions:</p> <p>Canadian Materials means steel, wood products, and aluminum that have undergone primary manufacturing and fabrication in Canada. Further details are available here.</p> <p>Canadian content means the part of a product or service that comes from Canada, including both goods and services.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - For services: A service counts as Canadian if it is provided entirely by people who are based in Canada. If only part of the work is done in Canada, then only that Canadian portion of the contract counts. - For goods: A good counts as Canadian if it is made in Canada. If only part of it is made in Canada, then only the value added in Canada counts. For imported goods, this is the difference between the import value and the final selling price, reflecting the value added by Canadian manufacturers and distributors.
