Raison d'être, mandate and role: who we are and what we do

Raison d'être

Western Economic Diversification Canada (WD) was established in 1987 to promote growth and diversification in the economy of the West. In August 2021, WD's operating name was changed to Prairies Economic Development Canada (PrairiesCan). PrairiesCan promotes economic growth and diversification in the economy of the Prairie provinces (Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba). PrairiesCan also advances the interests of the Prairie provinces in national economic policy, program, and project development and implementation.

The Minister of Northern Affairs is responsible for Prairies Economic Development Canada.

Mandate and role

PrairiesCan's mandate is to support economic growth and diversification in the Prairie provinces and advance the interests of the region in national economic policy, programs, and projects. The department fulfills this mandate through four key roles:

- **Investor** create jobs and growth through strategic investments and targeted initiatives.
- Convenor connect economic actors to support collaboration and growth.
- Advisor inform economic decision-making and advocate for prairie interests.
- Pathfinder help people navigate federal economic programs and services.
