



Site visit authorization: Request for exemption for a limited release from mandatory quarantine for compassionate reasons

All fields in this document are required.

You **must** submit a site visit authorization form in order to be exempt from COVID-19 mandatory quarantine requirements under the Compassionate Exemption Program. The form confirms that the listed travellers:

- are visiting for the specified purpose **and**
- may only visit the listed locations during the specified period

The person in charge of the location you will visit **must** complete and sign this form. This person is called the “signatory” on this form. Examples of signatories include:

- homeowner or proprietor
- an administrator of a health care facility
- funeral or bereavement services provider
- a health care professional who manages the site to be visited

Your name must be listed as a traveller on the form when you submit it. This form is valid for 1 month from the date of signature. You can use this form for multiple travellers, including minors.

I confirm that the traveller will be permitted to visit the above-mentioned facility or location for one of the following reasons (check one):

- To be present during the final moments of life, or to provide support or care for someone who is considered to be critically ill
- To provide care to a person who has a medical reason that requires support
- To attend a funeral or end of life ceremony

I recognize that, even if the traveller indicates that they are asymptomatic, there is a risk that they may be infected with the virus that causes COVID-19. Under the federal *Quarantine Act*, the traveller must:

- wear a well-constructed, well-fitting mask for the duration of their site visit
- maintain a 2-metre physical distance from others whenever possible

You may add other requirements to reduce the public health risk posed by the visit to your facility or site.

Providing false information: It is an offence under the *Quarantine Act* to provide a false or misleading statement. You may be subject to enforcement measures, such as a ticket under the *Contraventions Act* or prosecution under the *Quarantine Act*.

Due to the risks posed by COVID-19, people entering Canada are subject to the orders made under section 58 of the federal *Quarantine Act* (S.C. 2005, c. 20). The orders prohibit entry into Canada in certain instances and may require travellers to quarantine upon entering Canada. The quarantine period begins on the day the travellers enter Canada. The order is subject to certain exemptions, for example, travellers may apply for a limited release from quarantine (and/or permission to enter Canada, as required) for compassionate reasons in specific circumstances.



Privacy notice: The personal information provided is governed in accordance with the *Privacy Act*. This personal information is being collected as part of the Government of Canada's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and, at this time, the relevant Personal Information Bank may not yet reflect this activity. We collect the information needed for the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) to administer and enforce the Minimizing the Risk of Exposure to COVID-19 in Canada Order (Mandatory Isolation), the Quarantine Program (authorized under the *Quarantine Act*), and for programs or activities of PHAC authorized by the *Quarantine Act* and/or *Department of Health Act*. This information is collected and used by PHAC in relation to the traveller's application for "Exemption for Compassionate Reasons of COVID-19 Travel Restrictions" and/or "Limited Release from Quarantine" and may also be disclosed to the following entities: law enforcement (including, in particular, peace officers), other government institutions, as well as provincial, territorial, municipal governments or organizations as well as their institutions. In limited and specific circumstances, personal information may be used and disclosed without consent in accordance with subsection 8(2) of the *Privacy Act*.

Rights under the *Privacy Act*: In addition to protecting personal information, there is a right to request access to and request correction of one's own personal information as provided for under the *Privacy Act* and to file a complaint with the Privacy Commissioner of Canada concerning the handling of your information.
