Young Victorian Killed in France

Pte. George Newburn, who left Victoria with the 88th Battalion,
was killed August 16. Although only eighteen years of age, he had
spent twelve months in the trenches.

He was a native of London, and his mother died six years ago,
predeceasing the father by only four year. The family came to
Victoria in 1913, and the three sisters are now living here. He
made his home with his uncle, Mr. A. Gilson, 740 Hillside
Avenue, and up to the time of enlistment was employed by the
Canadian Pacific Telegraph Co. as messenger. His uncle, Mr.
Walter Newburn, of Esquimalt Road, is now serving in the
Canadian Navy
