DASHBOARD ON **FRANCOPHONE IMMIGRATION OUTSIDE QUEBEC – 2023**




In 2023, 81.3% of Francophone admissions outside Quebec were citizens of African and Middle Eastern countries, and only 12.9% were citizens of European countries.




Please note that there are differences in the country of residence (64.5% were living in African and Middle Eastern countries and 29.4% in European countries).

- In 2023, **285** events to promote Francophone immigration outside Quebec
- 19th edition of Destination Canada Mobility Forum in Paris, France, and Rabat, Morocco, in hybrid format:

 - **15,000** candidates invited to participate in person or online
 - **21** conferences and workshops

 - 935 job offers, representing more than 4,000 positions to fill

Promotion of Francophone immigration in Canada

- In 2023, more than **650** events promoting Francophone immigration across Canada outside Quebec)
- Nearly 200 specifically targeting Francophone minority communities, Francophone economic development organizations, foreign students, and employer groups seeking to hire Francophone workers
- The 2023 Liaison Tour, organized by RDÉE in partnership with IRCC, bringing together more than 110 employers and community stakeholders in Alberta, British Columbia and Nova Scotia, and allowing discussions on Francophone immigration tools and programs

Francophone Integration Pathway

- One of the major priorities of the call for proposals for 2024 is to strengthen the Francophone integration pathway. A strong French-speaking lens has been applied.
- The renewal and expansion of the Welcoming Francophone Communities initiative includes up to 10 new participating communities.
- The percentage of French-speaking newcomers served by Francophone service providers continued to rise: 62.3% in 2023, compared with **60.9%** the previous year.

• In 2023, IRCC continued to provide adult newcomers with opportunities to improve their language skills to successfully participate in Canadian society.

• In 2022–2023, more than **100,000** clients benefited from language training services from over 200 service providers.

• In April 2023, the Government of Canada announced the renewal of the Action Plan for Official Languages, including funding for language training services tailored to the needs of French-speaking newcomers settling in Francophone minority communities.
